News on the Ninth

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Nursery

In nursery we have been learning to rhyme. We have been making our own silly soup – soup made from rhyming ingredients and reading lots of rhyming stories.





Reception

We have had a great start to the spring term in Reception. To begin our new Talk4Writing text - Cops and Robbers - we became police investigators to find clues on who had stolen Jennie Jigsaw from our garden! We wrote wanted and missing posters for Grabber Dan and Jennie Jigsaw and letters to Officer Pugh to help him catch Grabber Dan. Eventually we found Jennie Jigsaw hidden in the orchard. We have created some brilliant story maps, retelling Grabber Dan's story and even included new 'villainous' characters in our own versions of the story. This has inspired us to learn about different



people who help us through their jobs, such as police officers, doctors, nurses, fire fighters and more! We were very lucky to be visited by parents who told us all about their interesting jobs where they help people too. A big thank you to all our visitors!

Year 1

As part of our Geography learning about our local area, we used an aerial



map to locate parts of our school. We noticed how different the school looks from above. We used these map reading skills to plot a journey around our local area, drawing our own maps and adding compass points and a key. Year 1 are looking forward to using these maps on our local walk next week.



Year 2



In Year 2 the children have been busy designing and making a photo frame in our design and technology lessons. We have begun the process by analysing existing photo frames, designing our own and have now begun to measure and saw the wood for our own frames. We are very excited for how our final photo frames will turn out!



Year 3



In English we have been looking at the features of non-chronological reports. We looked at how to collect notes and create sub headings. Linking our report to our History topic, Ancient Egyptians, we spent time collecting facts.

The children then planned out what they were going to include in their final report. We then spent time writing these reports making sure we included all the features of a non-

chronological report, such as: title, introduction, subheadings, paragraphs, 'did you know?' facts, pictures and captions



Year 4

In Year 4, we have been learning about persuasion. We started the unit learning the structure of the



text. To help us, we created a class text map and came up with actions to help us remember the key phrases. Later in the unit, we used this to help us with our own writing when we tried to persuade someone to visit a place which we like.

Year 5



Year 5 became 'Mini Medics' this month. They completed a course where they were taught first aid, how to assess a casualty (DRABC – Danger, Response, Airway, Breathing, CPR), how to perform effective CPR on a mannequin and how to put an unresponsive casualty into the recovery position.



Year 6

Year 6 have started lots of new and exciting topics across the curriculum. In Geography, we have

been learning about South America, We have been using atlases to locate different countries on this continent and exploring cities in Brazil by using 6 figure grid references.

In Art, we introduced The Aztecs – after researching the different forms of Aztec art, our aim over this unit is to design and create our own Aztec

masks!



In Science, we are looking at 'Evolution and Inheritance'. We started this unit of study by learning which features we have in common with

people in our family. Then we moved onto studying how animals and plants have adapted to live in their habitats before designing our own creature which could survive in extreme conditions.





Tottenham Football Coach Sessions



Over the past few weeks, the children in KS1 and lower KS2 have had the opportunity to develop their football skills by learning alongside

coaches from Tottenham Hotspur football club. They spent time developing the range of skills that build to play the sport, with a key focus on working as a team. These

sessions will be continuing after half term so that all children in KS1 and KS2 benefit from their expertise.







Active Travel Ambassadors (ATAs)

Our six ATAs have been crusading to make positive changes to the pavements in The Commons. The children took photos of cracks in the pavements, muddy grass verges and unsafe areas and have written to Grant Shapps MP about the situation. We are hoping that he will read our letter, see our photos and help us in our campaign for safer travel to and from school.

Update on Air conditioning installation

As the next phase of school site development, we are currently installing air conditioning into classrooms and central areas across the school. The junior block has now been completed.

This means, that while air conditioning is installed in each classroom, classes have been relocated to the modular classrooms to avoid disruption to learning. To avoid moving our youngest children, their rooms will be completed over the half term break.

We know that hot temperatures make it difficult for pupils to concentrate. By regulating the temperature of the classrooms, pupils will be able to concentrate even when temperatures outside are soaring. Pupils will also be able to safely take part in PE lessons in the air-conditioned halls throughout the hot weather.

We expect the work to be completed by the end of February which gives us plenty of time before the summer heat.

Anti-Abuse Curriculum

In order to embed the Anti-Abuse Curriculum into our teaching, each half term we are focusing on one theme which we will discuss in our classrooms during Snack and Discussion time. This half term, we focused on **Resilience and Wellbeing**. Some objectives linked closely with our PSHE topic (Dreams and Goals) as well as our discussion on the Emotion of the Month. Here are just some of the things we have been discussing across the school:

- When I make mistakes or have a bad experience, I have strategies to move forward positively.
- I know that I need to pay attention to my emotions and take care of my mental wellbeing.
- I have aspirations for the future, and I know how to plan to achieve those aspirations.
- I know how to help myself and others to calm down when angry or distressed.
- I know that everyone experiences ups and downs in their life: everyone struggles sometimes but talking about problems helps.

At home, why not speak with your child about their dreams and aspirations for the future. Reenforce the message that it is ok to make mistakes and normal to experience ups and downs – having ways to cope with these struggles and moving forward positively is what is most important.

Online Safety

February 8th was Safer Internet day which had the slogan "Together for a better internet". Our previous monthly theme of 'Self Image and Identify' and our discussions around this have fed nicely into the Safer Internet Day work.



February's online safety theme is "Managing online information"

For EYFS / KS1, please have some discussions around how internet can be used to find information and the digital technologies which allow us to do this.

For Lower KS2, discussing how information online may not be real (particularly now AI can generate fake images / videos as well)

For Upper KS2, discussing the differences between a 'belief', an 'opinion' and a 'fact. and how and where they might be shared online, e.g. in videos, memes, posts, news stories etc.

School Council

At the end of last term School Council asked the children which clubs they would like for the spring term. There were lots of ideas and far too many for us to accommodate! This term the School Council is getting involved with fundraising for Isabel Hospice and helping to sell books in our book sale which is happening today. We are hoping that everyone will support this event and we will let you know how much we have raised.

Emotion focus for this half term:


Happiness

Term time holidays

We are unable to authorise term time holidays. Absence can only be authorised if a child is unwell. If however, the number of unauthorised sessions reaches 15 or more within 2 terms, the local authority may issue you with a Penalty Notice. The Penalty Notice requires parents to pay a fine of £60 within 21 days. If this is not paid within the time limit, the penalty rises to £120 which must be paid within 28 days.

Term time holidays have a negative impact on friendships and learning. Please avoid taking your child out of school. Term time holidays are not authorised. Absence requests can only be authorised is there are exceptional, unrepeatable circumstances. Section 7 Education Act 1996 places a duty on parents to ensure that their child of compulsory age attends school.
