Online Safety Theme

January's Online Safety focus is 'Self Image and Identity'. At home, please could you have a discussion with your child regarding this area.

In EYFS and KS1, it could be discussing what to do if something happens that makes them feel sad, worried, uncomfortable or frightened.

In Lower KS2, we have been discussing how people can represent themselves in different ways online and not to fully trust everything as how it appears.

In upper KS2, discuss how to make responsible choices about having an online identity.

Device / App Parental controls

Almost all apps and devices now offer controls for parents. Parental controls on devices can offer different types of protection -from filtering out adult content in search results, to preventing your child from buying things when playing games. You can find instructions on how to set controls on the manufacturer's website, or to find specific guidance for your device, network or platform, visit the 'Internet Matters' website. Control settings will apply whether the device is being used in your home or outside. It's also easy for controls to be switched off, so make sure your child understands why the settings are in place.

Emotional Literacy focus

This half term, we will be learning about 'happiness': how it feels, what causes it and how it might look in someone else.

Please discuss this emotion with your child at home.

Our Wellbeing Committee have organised fun activities for classes to complete during discussion time to support our learning.

NSPCC's Speak out. Stay safe. programme

I am pleased to inform you that we are participating in the **NSPCC's Speak out. Stay safe. Programme** this term. This is a programme for children aged 5-11 which aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse. At Commonswood, children are taught to speak out if they are worried. This is actively encouraged and praised. All children select their trusted adults and record these on their helping hands (see a copy of this in homework books).

The *Speak out. Stay safe.* programme is delivered in an engaging and interactive way with the help of the NSPCC mascot Buddy. If you would like to know more about the *Speak out. Stay safe.* programme visit www.nspcc.org.uk/speakout.

We will be Talking PANTS during assembly next week. Talk PANTS is a simple conversation to help keep children safe from sexual abuse. Thank you to the parents who attended the parent forum on 5th December 2023 which focused on Preventing and Dealing with Racist Incidents.

The purpose of the policy:

All members of the school community (pupils, staff, governors, parents and visitors) have a right not to experience racism in school, whether or not this is directed at them. Commonswood Primary & Nursery School values all children and seeks to ensure that they learn that challenging hurtful behaviour and discrimination is an important part of their education.

Racism is evident in wider society therefore inevitably will occur in schools. Commonswood Primary & Nursery School will work actively to:

- Develop a climate which is intolerant to racism
- Ensure an atmosphere in which all pupils feel valued and listened to and have confidence that their concerns will be addressed

Pupils are taught about racism, that it is unacceptable and that it diminishes all. As a school we recognise and value diversity by ensuring that:

- All pupils have an equal and strong sense of belonging within the school community
- Racist incidents, are dealt with effectively and recorded and reported to the Governing Board
- Pupils from different ethnic and faith and cultural backgrounds mix and get on well with each other

Discussions with parents resulted in further clarification of the education provided to pupils to prevent racism.

This includes regular lessons from our anti-abuse curriculum because not only do we want to educate children not to be abusive, we also want children to stand up against abuse. This statement has been added to the policy.

'In addition to the personal, social, health education (PSHE) curriculum, pupils learn an antiabuse curriculum. This comes under 7 main headings. We teach each aspect through a whole school focus approach.

- Identity
- Resilience & wellbeing
- Character & personal values
- Diversity & community
- Keeping safe, knowing what is not okay & restoring safety
- Body & relationship safety
- Critical thinking '

Each month, we have a whole school focus where age-appropriate discussions will take place to cover this learning.

To reflect the law, reference to Government legislation has been added to the policy.

In addition to the responding to incidents section of the policy, parents suggested a flow diagram be added. This is now included in the policy. This gives parents/carers a clear understanding of the actions taken if an incident were to occur.

Flow chart of actions taken Initial reporting



Incident logged and passed to a senior member of staff



Rapid incident investigation by senior leader (which may include gathering witness statements)



Support in place for victims



Parents of victim and perpetrator notified



Ongoing monitoring of victim's wellbeing/Consequences/referrals and education in place for perpetrator



Ongoing monitoring of victim's wellbeing/Ongoing monitoring of perpetrator's behaviour/guidance for parents

Parents at the forum expressed their appreciation of anti-abuse curriculum and the rigor around the policy. They approved of the changes to the current policy.

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Term time holidays

We are unable to authorise term time holidays. Absence can only be authorised if a child is unwell. If however, the number of unauthorised sessions reaches 15 or more within 2 terms, the local authority may issue you with a Penalty Notice. The Penalty Notice requires parents to pay a fine of £60 within 21 days. If this is not paid within the time limit, the penalty rises to £120 which must be paid within 28 days.

Term time holidays have a negative impact on friendships and learning. Please avoid taking your child out of school. Term time holidays are not authorised. Absence requests can only be authorised is there are exceptional, unrepeatable circumstances. Section 7 Education Act 1996 places a duty on parents to ensure that their child of compulsory age attends school.











Commonswood Primary & Nursery School is a Safeguarding School We are an Encompass School working with external agencies to support children who are victims of domestic abuse.
