We have been learning about autumn. We looked for leaves and noticed how they had changed colour and are beginning to fall from the trees. We read the story 'Leaf Man' and used leaves to create our own pictures. During Black History Month we learnt what a difference people such as Rosa Parkes and Maya Angelou have made in our world.

Reception

In Reception, we have been learning and retelling the story of the Little Red Hen, as well as telling our own versions of the story where she planted an apple seed, grew an apple tree and baked apple pie. This inspired us to bake our own apple pies! We carefully peeled and chopped the apples to put inside. They were delicious!





We also celebrated Black History Month and learnt about lots of interesting figures including: Louis Armstrong, Mae Jemison and Florence Joyner. We even watched Josephine Baker dancing and practised some of our own dance moves.

Year 1



In Year 1 we have been learning about Animals including humans. We looked at some real fish, we named the body parts, compared



them to other animals and used our observational skills to draw them. We discussed what an animal needs to be classified as fish. They were very smelly!

Year 2



During Black History Month Year 2 researched the life of Mary Seacole. We found out a lot about her life and how she was a significant person. We then wrote some non-chronological reports about her life.

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Year 3

In Year 3 for Black History Month, we have been learning about George Washington Carver. We researched, using iPads and laptops, about his life, his work and the impact his work has had. We then created fact files based on our research.









We have also been researching and tasting Stone Age food and made our own Stone Age Stew. We learnt that root vegetables are tastier than we thought!

Year 4


In Year 4, as part of our Romans unit, we visited Verulamium Museum where we took part in an artefacts workshop and learnt about Roman life. We saw the hypocaust (underground heating),



mosaics and roman coffins. For Black History month, we learnt about Barrack and Michelle Obama.

For Black History Month Year 5 focused on the life and work of Lonnie Johnson. We were surprised that he had been involved in so many projects – The Galileo and Cassini projects for NASA, had been



We also participated in a road safety 'Distractions' workshop, where children learnt about keeping safe when they are out walking with a focus on how mobile phones are a distraction to all.



Year 6



Last month, to celebrate Black History Month, children researched and produced posters on Lilian Bader. Lilian Bader was the first black woman to join the RAF and children learnt about the hardships and prejudices Bader faced growing up.

Before half term, all year 6 children got to experience a fun and very action-packed week- whether it was

at SKERN or at school. The children (and staff) that went to SKERN had a brilliant time surfing, rafting, tunnelling and much more. We were all really proud of the team work and perseverance all the children demonstrated during the activities as well as overcoming many fears and challenges through the help of encouragement from their friends.



The children who didn't go on the residential trip to Skern participated in a variety of activities in



school including making clay sculptures, cooking, and sports such as basketball and curling. They also went on two trips; one to Standalone Farm and one to the Hatfield Bunker which is a WWII museum set in a real-life bunker underneath Hatfield police station.

started in 2017 as a way to deter bullying in school. With the rise of technology and the added pressure children face on social media and at school, the Anti-Bullying Alliance created the day to remind people that it's good to stand out. By expressing oneself without fear of judgment reaffirms the idea that being who you are is more than enough. If we can appreciate someone else's odd socks, we can also appreciate each individual's differences.

Online Safety

In November our theme will be "Online Bullying". At home, please could you have a discussion with your child regarding this area.

- In EYFS, it could cover how unkind words make people feel
- In KS1 how to act and communicate nicely online and what to do if you feel upset by things online
- In Lower KS2, different ways people might be bullied online and the importance of thinking carefully about how posted content / actions in a game may make others feel
- In Upper KS2, how to report online bullying within different apps / websites and when it is appropriate to report to the police

Online Games

Do you know what your child is saying when they play online? Do you know what is said to them? Unfortunately, not all children play games in a room where they are monitored by an adult. Children tend to get a bit excited when playing games online and because they cannot see their friends faces, their language can sometimes push the boundaries of what is appropriate. They are more likely to be rude, offensive or say things which hurt other's feelings as they cannot see the facial expression of others.

To keep your children and their friends safe, please:

- talk to them about appropriate language while online
- talk to them about negative experiences
- ensure they know how to block their friends who are rude
- where possible, monitor them whilst playing

Term time holidays

We are unable to authorise term time holidays. Absence can only be authorised if a child is unwell. If however, the number of unauthorised sessions reaches 15 or more within 2 terms, the local authority may issue you with a Penalty Notice. The Penalty Notice requires parents to pay a fine of £60 within 21 days. If this is not paid within the time limit, the penalty rises to £120 which must be paid within 28 days.

Term time holidays have a negative impact on friendships and learning. Please avoid taking your child out of school. Term time holidays are not authorised. Absence requests can only be authorised is there are exceptional, unrepeatable circumstances. Section 7 Education Act 1996 places a duty on parents to ensure that their child of compulsory age attends school.
