



## Sports Funding Strategy 2021/2022

Total budget consists of £16000 and £10 per child in KS1/KS2 Total - £19,570.

The rationale behind the spending of the PE and Sports premium funding is:

Priority 1: To increase the proportion of children achieving/exceeding age-related expectations

Priority 2: To further develop the quality of teaching in PE

Priority 3: To promote healthy lifestyles, widen participation and further develop children's access to competitive sports
